

HUD RECOVERY ACT PROGRAMS



The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act) includes \$13.61 billion to help stabilize and revive local neighborhoods and housing markets with heavy concentrations of foreclosed properties.

The County of Kern received recovery funds for these programs:

Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)

County of Kern has been allocated NSP funds of \$11,211,385 to mitigate the impact of foreclosures through the purchase and rehabilitation of foreclosed, vacant properties in order to create more affordable housing and renew neighborhoods devastated by the economic crisis.

Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP)

County of Kern has been allocated \$2,076,503 for prevention of homelessness and enabling rapid re-housing of homeless families and individuals and helping them reenter the labor market.

Community Development Block Grant Program Recovery Funds (CDBG-R)

County of Kern has been allocated \$1,357,938 to stimulate the local economy by creating/retaining jobs through the construction of infrastructure and other eligible development projects. "Shovel ready" projects for which contracts can be awarded within 120 days of the date funds are made available are to be given priority.
