ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR JUNE 2010

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 239.5 hours in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, exercising, grooming, and off-site adoptions. Two off-site events were held this month and accounted for 51.50 hours of the 239.5 volunteer time. Seven dogs were adopted out as a result of these two events. Low volunteer hours were attributed to volunteer vacations and requests for time-off.
- The Marketing & Promotions Associate attended the Bakersfield Adult School's Health Fair. During this half hour event, approximately 75 individuals received information on animal control services, importance of spaying/neutering pets, information on vaccinating and licensing dogs and responsible pet ownership.
- The Division was represented at the 2010 Hispanic Health Fair by the Director, the Marketing & Promotions Associate and two KCAC volunteers. Attendees received information about responsible pet ownership, spay/neuter options in the County, keeping pets healthy, information on vaccinations and disaster preparedness for pets.
- June was Adopt-A-Cat month. Unfortunately, we did not reach our goal of 200 cats adopted. Even with the media coverage and low adoption prices of \$10 and \$5, cats were not being adopted. We did not have an increase in the number of cats adopted over last year June.
- We continue to have a high number of rescues in June, but our number of dogs adopted was lower than last year June.
- The Division in conjunction with Dr. Kristina Love held low cost rabies clinics the first and third Wednesday of the month. 50 dogs were vaccinated and licensed at these clinics.
- The Director presented to the Board of Supervisor the 4 month update of the PEET Program. The program has been very successful and the Board of Supervisors voted to continue the program.
